

**Catherine Pessa-Miquel** is Emeritus Professor of English Literature at the University of Lyon 2. Her research focuses on the contemporary novel and on travel literature, exploring questions of narratology, intertextuality, postcolonialism, and problematics linked to identity and feminism. She has published books and articles on American novelists (Willa Cather and Paul Auster), British novelists (Graham Swift in particular) and Indo-Anglian authors. She published a monography on Paul Auster in 1996 (*Toiles trouées et désert lunaires dans Moon Palace de Paul Auster*, Presses de la Sorbonne Nouvelle), Willa Cather in 2001 (*Alexander's Bridge, de Willa Cather*, Éditions du Temps), Salman Rushdie in 2007 (*Salman Rushdie, l'écriture transportée*, Presses Universitaires de Bordeaux) and on Anita Desai in 2008 (*In Custody de Anita Desai*, Atlante).
